I Thomas Young of the County of Sussex being Sick and Weak in body, but of sound & disposing mind and Memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same and calling to mind the certainty of Death, and the uncertainty of this Transitory life, Do constitute make & ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner following, That is to say first and principally I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it me, hoping for Salvation through the Merits & Mediations of my Blessed Redeemer Jesus Christ and as for my Body I recommend it to the Earth to be decently interred at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named, and as to my worldly Estate whereunto it hath pleased God to be bless me with, after my Just Debts & funeral expences are paid I give and dispose of as follows.

Rem unto my loving Wife Katherine Young my Negro Boy Bob during her natural Life, and likewise unto my said wife during her natural Life my Negro man Sam, I also give unto my said wife all my personal Estate of what kind or quality (except) such specific Legacies as shall be hereafter mentioned) to her & her heirs forever.

Item

I give & bequeath unto my loving Friend Mary Mason the wife of my Friend David Mason, the sum of Ten Pounds current Money to be made out of my Estate.

Item

I give & bequeath unto Littlebury Mason son of David Mason my Young Man Dolly.

Item

I give & bequeath unto my loving Nephew Thomas Young, son of my Brother John Young, my Negro boy Bob after the

Death of my loving wife. And I also leave unto my said Nephew all my wearing Apparel of Linen & Woollen whatsover. I give unto my loving Friend David Mason my Negro Man Sam after the Death of my loving Wife to him & his heirs forever. I desire that my Estate may not be Appraised.

And lastly, I nominate constitute & appoint my loving Friend David Mason my whole sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament, hereby Revoking & making null and void all former Wills & Legacies heretofore by me made & allowing Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Affixed my Seal this 29 Day of November 1770
