the Lark to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter
named, and as for my worldly goods I give and devise as followeth.

Impromised. I give and devise to my brother William Hancock the use of my negro for the
Year 1762, and 1763.

Item, I give and devise to my Sister Mary Hancock all my wearing Cloaths, and further
my desire is that all the rest of my Estate be it of what kind or property soever may be
equally divided between my brothers and Sisters, namely, William, Benjamin
Anthony, Dettice, Ducey, Hannah & Mary Hancock.

Item, I leave my brother William Hancock, and my brother in law Frederick Green
Executors to fulfil this my last will and Testament. In Witnesps whereof I have
hereunto set my hands and Seal the day and year above written.
