I bequeath my land and plantation whereon I now live to my son Allen Jones Burrow containing by Estimation One Hundred and forty Acres be the same more or less, provided my said son Allen Jones Burrow arrive to the age of Twenty one or hath full, and in case my said son doth not arrive to the said age of Twenty one or hath not full then I bequeath the said land & premises to my beloved Wife her & her Heirs for ever.

After my Debts are paid I bequeath to my beloved Wife Mary Burrow one half of my Estate, which said Estate I leave to be equally divided by three majorities of this County between my beloved Wife aforesaid & my son Allen Jones Burrow except one side Saddle and Bridle which I bequeath to my
