The last Will and Testament of William Andrews, In the Name of God Amen the fifth day
October 1768 I William Andrews of the Parish of Allmarley County of Suffolk being sick in body
but good and perfect Memory Thanks be to Almighty God and calling to Remembrance the
uncertain Estate of this transitory Life and that all Flesh must yield unto death where
it shall please God to call us make and declare this my last will and Testament in manner
and form following First being Protestant and sorry for all my sins most humbly desiring
Forgiveness for the same I commend my soul unto Almighty God my Saviour & Redeemer in
whom and by whose Merits I trust & believe assuredly to be saved and to have full Remission and
Forgiveness of all my sins and to inherit the Kingdom of Heaven and my Body I commit to the
Earth to be decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named and for the settling
of my temporal Estate and such Goods Chattels and Debts as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me
I do now give and dispose the same in manner and form following
I give and bequeath one Negro Boy named Sam^l Lewis to my Son Henry Andrews

 former Wills and Bequests by me made and declaring this only to be my last Will &
 Testament
