In the name of God Amen I William Williams being sick and weak, but in perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for the same, do constitute and appoint this my last will and Testament in manner and form following. I give my Soul to Almighty God who gave it me, and my body to the Church to be buried at the discretion of my Executors, and as to my worldly estate I give devise and bequeath the same in manner and form following.

Imp^{ro}vis^o I give and bequeath to my loving wife the use of my Plantation whereon I now live during her life and also two negroes Tom and Sally during her life, and also the use of Mold-Nan, Mingo and Sydie during her widowhood, also I give her the use of half my stock and household furniture during her life.

Imp^{ro}vis^o I give and bequeath to my Son John Williams two negroes Toney & Duck to be his when he arrives at the age of twenty one.

Imp^{ro}vis^o I give and bequeath to my Son William Williams all my land lying of the lower side of Hager Swamp to him and his heirs forever.

Imp^{ro}vis^o I give and bequeath to my Son Charles Williams all my Land of the upper side of Hager Swamp to him and his heirs forever, but if my Son Charles dies before he arrives to the age of twenty I give the Land to my Son William, and if my Son William dies before he arrives of age I give the whole Land to Charles and his heirs forever.

I promise I give and bequeath to Son Samuel William the Plantation whereon I now live, also all my Land at the Cypress Swamp, and all the Land I had of Drury Spain to him and his Heirs forever. but if he dies before he comes of Age I give all the said to the Child my wife is with Child with but if that should die before it comes of age, my desire is that the Land be equally divided between my two Sons William and Charles.

I promise I give the use of two negroes to the Child unborn if it be a boy, viz. Toney and Such and also the profit arising from my Plantation at Sweets, till my Son William comes to the age of twenty one, but if it be a girl I desire my Estate may be equally divided amongst my Children that I have by my late wife, viz. William, Charles, Samuel, Mary and Elizabeth and the Child unborn.

I give and bequeath to Dennis Tyus all my Lands that is adjoining the said Tyus in Brunswick County, on his paying fifty five pounds, according to an agreement made before Nathaniel Bridge and Ephraim Parish, to him and his Heirs forever.

I desire that the money that is due to me from several persons may be applied towards the Education and maintenance of my Children at the discretion of my executors. I desire that Seymour Powell of Brunswick, may have the care of my Son John William's estate on his giving good Security to my Executors for the trust imposed in him. I desire my Estate may not be appraised I constitute and appoint James Jones, John Lucas, and my loving wife Executors of this my last will and Testament, given under my hand and Seal this 24. day of December 1764.
