In the name of God amen. I William Heeth Jun: of Albemarle County in the County of Sussex being in perfect Health & disposing memory. Thanks be to Almighty God for the same, do make & ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner and form following Viz:

Imprimis I leave the use of all my Estate both real & personal to my loving wife Margaret Heeth during her Widowhood, and then I give & bequeath the same as follows.

Item I Give and Bequeath to my said wife, and to her Heirs forever, my Negro Fellow called Frank, and my Negro woman called Patt and all my household goods, and all my Stocks of Cattle sheep Hogs & Horses.

Item I Give & bequeath to be equally divided between my said Sons Suth Heeth, Henry Heeth, Howell Heeth, Augustine Heeth, Joses Heeth & William Heeth, and my Daughter Margaret Heeth & my Daughter Jane Heeth and to their Heirs forever, after the decease of my said wife Margaret, and to their Heirs forever, (even Negroes) & their increase Viz: Dinah, Anahy, Dick, Sam, Monday, Lewis & Jacob; but in case my said wife should die or marry before my said Son William Heeth should arrive to the age of twenty one Years then it is my will, that the said Negroes be not divided before the said William do come to the age of twenty one year.

Item I Give & bequeath to my son Suth Heeth and to his Heirs forever after the Death or Marriage of my said wife Margaret, my Land & Plantation known & now lies, and fifty Acres of the lower part of my Land joining Abraham Heeths Land of William Heeth Senior.

Item I Give & devise to be equally divided in kind & quality to my two Sons Henry & Howell Heeth and to their Heirs forever after the Death or marriage of my said wife Margaret my two Tracts of Land containing one hundred & seventy five Acres and entries thence adjoining lying upon the North side of Joseph Swamps.

Item I Give & bequeath unto my son Augustine Heeth Twenty Pounds current Money of Virginia when he shall arrive to the age of twenty one Years.

Item I Give Bequeath unto my son Joses Heeth Twenty Pounds current Money of Virginia when he shall arrive to the age of twenty one Years.

Item I Give & bequeath unto my son William Heeth Twenty Pounds current Money of Virginia when he shall arrive to the age of twenty one Years.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Margaret Heeth and to her Heirs forever my Negro Girl called Sath.

Item I Give & bequeath unto my Daughter Jane Heeth & to her Heirs forever my Negro Girl called Lyada.

Lastly I do appoint & ordain my loving Wife Margaret Heeth my whole & sole Executrix of this my last Will & Testament annulling all former Will by me made. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this seventeenth day of June in the Year of our Lord 1769.
