Slaves that I had by her Named Charles Lincky Patt Anthony Tom and Lydia also Three Bedsteads Furniture two Potts four Dishes one Dozen of Plates one Dozen of Knives and Forks one Frying Pan Two Tables two Horses Two Spinning Wholes and Chairs & Chest One Trunk and one Single Chair and Harness and my will and desire is that my said wife shall have her first Choice of all the abovementioned Articles that I shall die possessed of and all my Stock of Hatch to her and her Heirs for ever Also I ent my said wife the following Negroes N<sup>e</sup> Tillah Nan & Sam during her widow hood but if my said wife should continue a Widow untill my son Herbert comes of Age or then my will and desire is that my two last mentioned Negroes Nan and Sam should be delivered unto the said Herbert

I Will I give and bequeath unto my Loving Son Herbert all the rest residue and remainder of my Estate of every sort or kind whatsoever to him and his Heirs for ever and my will and desire is that if my son Herbert dies before he arrives of Age or Marries that the whole of the Estate that would have fallen to him shall be divided between the Children of my Three brothers John David and Benjamin Owen and I desire that my brother John should take under his care and management my said son Herbert for which trouble I bind the said John the Negro fellow named Bob untill my said son John comes of Age or Marries

I Will I do constitute ordain and Appoint my Loving wife Executrix and my Friends Robert Jones Junior & John Gaigill my whole and sole Executors of this my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this Fifth day of February Anno Domini thousand Seven hundred and seventy Two
