In the Name of God amen I Ann Willbourn of Albemarle Parish in Sussex County being Sick and Weak but in perfect mind and Memory thanks be to God for it I do therefore constitute and appoint this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following Viz I give my Soul to Almighty God who gave it me and my body to the Earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned and as to the Temporal Estate which it hath been pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath in manner and form following

Imprimis — I give and bequeath to my Grand daughter Amey Knight one Bed and boulder one Spinning Wheel and Cards one Drawn half my Cotton Two Warrels of Corn one Ox Iron and Hooks and one half of my Kissing apparel to her and her Heirs for ever But if my Grand daughter Amey Knight dies before she comes of age or marries my desire is that what I have willed to her may be Equally divided between my son Benjamin Willbourn and my Daughter Ann Lynn to them and their Heirs for ever

Item I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Ann Lynn half my wearing apparel and one shilling to her and her Heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Susannah Weather one shilling to her and her Heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath to my son Barrett Willbourn one shilling to him and his Heirs for ever

Item I give and Bequeath to my Grandson John Willbourn one shilling to him and his Heirs for ever

Item I give and Bequeath to my son William Willbourn one shilling to him and his Heirs for ever

Item I give and Bequeath to my Grandson William Willbourn one shilling to him and his Heirs for ever

Item I give and Bequeath to my son Benjamin Willbourn all and every of my Estate not herebefore mentioned of whatsoever kind it be to him and his Heirs for ever

I constitute and appoint my son Benjamin Willbourn executor of this my last will and Testament
