In the Name of God. I Edward Pettway of the Parish of
 Bristol in the County of Dinwiddie being sick & weak in Body but of perfect
 Sense & Memory do make & declare this my last Will & Testament in
 a Manner following; First I bequeath my Soul into the Hand of
 Almighty God hoping & believing a Remission of my Sins by the Merits
 of Satisfaction of Jesus Christ and my Body I commit to the Earth to be
 buried at the Discretion of my Executor herein after named And my
 worldly Estate I give and devise as follows my just Debt & funeral
 Charges being first paid
 First I give unto my Brother John Pettway of Sup^r and to his Heirs forever
 one Negro Man Will now in the Possession of my said Brother & also
 Twelve Pounds ten shillings current Money
 Also I give unto my Brother Robert Pettway & to his Heirs forever my Land
 & Plantation whereon I now live containing Two hundred Acres more or less
 As also my negro Man Bob and Negro Woman Meriah and all my Books
 but in Case my Brother Robert should die before he arrives to the Age of
 twenty one Years or without Lawful Issue then my Will and Desire is that
 the Two Estates above mentioned, as also the Land and Plantation and Books
 should go to my Brother John Pettway & his Heirs forever
 Also I give to my Sister Susannah Pettway and to her Heirs forever my negro
 Woman Sukey and my little Girl Aggy
 Also I give to my Sister Elizabeth Pettway and to her Heirs forever three three
 Negroes viz^t Foney, Hannah & Ephraim
 Also my Will & Desire is that if William Pettway Son Rob^t. de^d. and John
 Pettway Son of Edward of Brunswick should each of them arrive to the
 Age of twenty one Years that all the Test^t & Residue of my Estate not heretofore
 mentioned should be equally divided between the said William & John but in
 Case of the Death of either then my Desire is that the survivor should have the whole

but in Case of the Death both then my Passer is that my Sister Susannah Pittway should have all the Legacy devised to her said William & John Pittway -
 Lastly, My Will & Desire is that there be no Inventory nor appraisment of my Estate -
 And I do nominate and appoint my Brother John Pittway whole & sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament. At Witness my Hand & Seal this twenty third day of July Anno Domini One thousand Seven hundred & Seventy Seven -

Also I give and devise to my Daughter Suannah wife of Edward Pittway my Three Negroes Usser, Jack, and Charles, to her and her Heirs for ever likewise one fourth part of my Crop
Also I give and devise to my Daughter Elizabeth and her Heirs my four Negroes Jimme, J. purchased of Benjamin Harrison Esq. Sancio, Jude and Limie also one Leather Bed and Furniture Eight head of Butt Battle Six pewter Dishes Six pewter Plates Six Table Knives and Forks Six Rush Bottom Chairs Twenty Pounds Current money and one fourth part of my Crop

Also I give and devise to my son Edward and his Heirs for ever my Lot 8023 in Robert Ravenscroft Lottery also my seven Negroes Will, Joe, Sue, Hannah, Marah, Agge and Epharim also half my Stock of Horses Mares Cattle Sheep Hogs and fowls not otherwise devised also half my Household Furniture Kitchen Furniture Lumber, Books, Plantation Tools and Utensils

Also I give and devise to my son Robert and his Heirs for ever my two pair of Mill Stones my still and Furniture belonging to her also all the money that I may have in the House likewise all the money of Horses Cattle Sheep Hogs and fowls and half of my Crops due and owing to my Estate by Judgements Bonds notes or Open Accounts half my Stock of all kinds half my Household Furniture Kitchen Furniture Lumber Books, Plantation Tools and Utensils

I also give and devise to my said son Robert and his Heirs for ever my Nine Negroes Peter Tab, Kate, Tom, Sarah, Ben, Cuffie, Phillis, Lepe,

Also I give and devise to all and every of the Legatees and their respective Heirs all the Issue of the Female Negroes to them devised that may be born from the date of this will to my Death

Also my will and desire is that all my last debts and Funeral Expenses be paid out of my Crops or Household Furniture as also my Daughter Elizabeths Twenty Pounds Current money her pewter knives and forks and Cattle before a division also her Chairs

I also ^{do hereby appoint} my two sons Edward and Robert to be whole and sole Executors of this my last will and Testament and devise this my Estate may not be appraised In Writs whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this Tenth day of February the Fourth seven hundred and twenty Three
