Mercy & Goodness of God though weak in Body yet of a sound and perfect
Understanding and Memory do constitute this my last Will and Testament
and desire it to be rec^d. by all as such -

Item I give and bequeath to my Son Edward Davis one Man also one
pewter Dish also one iron Scillet which is now in his possession also one
Pork of Salt and fifty Shillings in Money to him and his heirs forever -

Item I give and bequeath to my Son Charles Davis Two Sheep also one Pork
of Salt and ten Pounds in Money to him and his heirs forever -

Item I give and bequeath to my Son Hardeman Davis the Money that he is
owing me to him & his heirs forever -

Item I give and bequeath to my Son in law John Spain five Pounds in Money
also to his Wife one gownd Petticoat to them & their heirs forever -

Item I give and bequeath to my Son in law James Pock five Pounds in
Money also to my Daughter his Wife one Quilt and two Choices of my Gowns
also two Petticoats to them & their heirs forever -

Item I give and bequeath to my Son in law Christopher Spaker ten Pounds
in Money also to my Daughter his Wife one woollen Gownd also two Petticoats
to them & their heirs forever -

Item I give and bequeath to my Son Wm Davis one Pair of Best Wools also
a Hair in Coulters and plow Har also one iron Wedg also two Axes likewise
my small field of Corn standing before my Door also one weeding Hoe
also one killing Hoe also twenty Shillings in Silver to him & his heirs forever -

Item I give and bequeath to my Son in law Samuel Wilburn fifteen Pence
in Money to him and his heirs forever -

Item I give and bequeath to my Son Thomas Davis five Pounds in Money
to him & his heirs forever -

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Susanna Davis one Bed &
Furniture also a piece Cloth wrap in my Chest to her and her heirs forever
I also desire that my Cattle Hogs and my Part of the Corn now growing -
except such a part which I have willed to Son Wm Davis may be sold and

and the Money equally divided among my Children David Wilkin excepted I also leave forty Shillings in the Hands of my Son Witt to be employed toward educating his Son Tommy the ten Pounds which I give to Christopher Toaker is Money which I took from which is now in his own Hands Also the ten Pounds which I give to my Son Charles Davis is now in his own Hands Also the Sheep mentioned to Charles Davis one -

Ewe and Weather - I also give to James Cook one Ewe to him and his Heirs forever - I also give to my Son Witt One Ram to him and his Heirs forever - I also give to Christopher Toaker two Weathers to him and his Heirs forever - I also give to John Spain one Weather to him and his Heirs forever and one Weather remaining to be sold and the Money equally divided -

I also give and bequeath to my son Witt Davis all my one Bushel and one half of Salt should be sold except enough for one pair of Shoes which I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Toaker I also give to my gran Daughter Jean Cook one pair of Battamans Shoes also one pair of Buck Leather Slaves to her and her Heirs forever - I also give to my Son Charles Davis my small Iron Pot to him and his Heirs forever - I also give to my Son in Law Christopher Toaker one Iron and two Plates to him and his Heirs forever - I also give and bequeath to my Daughter Jean Toaker one Petticoat to her and her Heirs forever - I also give to my gran Son Tommy (the son of Witt Davis) one Petticoat I also give to my Daughter Elizabeth Toaker my great coat to her and her Heirs forever - I also give to my Son Witt Two Medals of Bacon also one Side of Beef to him and his Heirs forever - I desire that all and every of my Estate exclusive of one Bushel and an half of Salt should be sold and after payment of my just Debt the Money to be equally divided among my Children David Witt Davis and Christopher Toaker divided between James Cook John Spain Witt Davis and Christopher Toaker except half a Bushel which I desire to be sold I have four Cheeses which I desire should be equally divided between Witt Davis James Davis and John Toaker Only Witt Davis to have two of the four I do also appoint Christopher Toaker joint Executor with my Son Witt Davis of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this

The last Will and Testament of John Davis was presented in Court by Christopher Toaker & Witt Davis the Executors therein named who made Oath thereto according to Law & the same was proved by the Oath of William Hardy and Eliam Hartley Witnesses thereto and Ordered to be recorded and in the Motion of the said Executors who gave Bond with Caution as the Law directs Certificate is granted them for obtaining a Probate thereof in due
