Second year of the Commonwealth

In the name of God Amens, I John Bargill of the County of Sussex, Virginia, recollecting the mortality of man and being in a weak estate of health at present but professed of my understanding and memory, do make and ordain this my last Will and testament hereby revoking all others after committing my soul and body to God hoping for his gracious acceptance of them thro' Jesus Christ. I dispose of my worldly estate as follows.

Item I give and bequeath to my son John Bargill and his heirs forever the plantation whereon I now live.

Item I give and bequeath to my second son unbaptized all my land on the Aspinwall swamp to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give to my affectionate and beloved wife the use and profits arising from the plantation whereon I now live and that of the Aspinwall together with the slaves (excepting those hereafter given) horses, cattle, sheep, hogs, household furniture and every other possession for the purpose of paying my debts, educating and supporting my children during her widowhood.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Bargill the following negroes, Paul, Anthony, Austin, Jemmy the elder, Silvia, Nancy, Jemmy, and their issue forever. And also the following negroes at my Wifes decease or marriage, I give to her and her heirs Ben, Judy, Doctor, & Isabel and their issue.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Lucy Rivers Bargill and her heirs for ever, the following slaves, Lewis, Randal, Nat, Roger, Clarissa, Violet, Pott, and their issue. And after the same manner I give to her and her heirs, Lucy, Beck and Dick with their issue whenever my wife dies or marries.

Item I give and bequeath to Sarah Bargill my youngest daughter and her heirs forever the following negroes, Ben, Allen, Jemmy, the younger, Simon, Faithy, Betty, Faithy, & their issue. Also Betty, Nell, little Harry and their issue at my wifes decease or marriage.

Item I give and bequeath to my two sons the reversion and reversione of all the remaining slaves and estate whatsoever to be equally divided by three men appointed for that purpose by the Worshipful Court of Sussex.

For the due execution of this my last Will & testament nominate, constitute and appoint my beloved wife Anne Bargill Executrix and John Mafordburg and Hugh Belches Executors and it is my desire that no part of my estate be appraised.

Item I give and bequeath to my son William Rogers to him and his heirs forever the plantation whereon he now lives, beginning at Market tree in the Bridge branch, thence a straight course to the fork of the Branch Island road, thence up the Seacock road to Bliford Plantation line, thence down the said line, to the one between me and Michael Bailey thence down the said line to the aforesaid tree in the said branch.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Rogers to him and his heirs forever, one tract or parcel of land bounded as follows beginning at the above mentioned tree in the bridge branch thence down my line to Brown's line thence down Brown's line to the main run in the Black water swamp thence up the said run to the mouth of the old spring branch thence up the said branch to the head of the east prong in my old field thence a straight to the fork of the Branch Island road.
