November the 19 day 1777.

In the name of God amen I John Baird of Supers
County being in my rational senses and perfect memory and calling to
mind the uncertainty of life and being willing to settle my worldly affairs, do
make and ordain this my last Will and testament in manner and form
following.

1st Item. I give and devise unto my son Stephen Baird two hundred acres of land more
or less which I bought of Thomas Ivey to him and his heirs forever.

2nd Item. I give and devise unto my said son Stephen Baird one negroe man named
Jare to him and his heirs forever.

3rd Item. I give and devise unto my son William Baird three hundred and twenty
five acres of land more or less whereon I now dwell to him and his heirs
forever.

4th Item. I give and devise unto my said son William Baird one negroe man named
Aaron and one negroe woman named Dinah to him and his heirs forever.

5th Item. I ordain my two sons Stephen Baird and William Baird Executors of this my
last Will and testament.

6th Item. My Will is that my estate shall not be appraised.
