In the Name of God Amen This twenty fourth day of April one thousand seven hundred and seventy three I John Hardie of St. Lucie County being very sick & weak the' of a perfect and sound disposing mind and memory thanks be to God for it however not knowing how soon my change may come do therefore ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following Viz.

- Item* I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Roullet one Bed and furniture and such other things as she has in possession to her & her heirs forever
- Item* I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Man one bed and furniture which she has in possession also one Cow & Calf to her & her heirs forever
- Item* I give and bequeath to my Daughter Rachel Studevant one bed and furniture one Cow & Calf which she has in possession to her & her heirs forever
- Item* I give and bequeath to my Son William Hardie all my Land on the north side of the Hunting Quarter Swamp also my Negro Boy Jacob also one Bed and furniture also one Cow and Calf also six Plates and one Basin also one Dish also one Iron pot also one Belmentall Shellit Also one Cow and Lamb to him & his Heirs forever my desire is that my Wife may live on my plantation that I have given to my Son William Hardie till such times as she can get a house built on my Son Thomas Hardie's Land
- Item* I give and bequeath unto my Son Thomas Hardie my Negro Girl Nan also all my Land lying in the fork of the Hunting Quarter swamp also one Cow & Calf also one Bed Furniture also one Gun and six plates also one Chest also one Cow and Lamb to him and his Heirs forever my desire is that if either of my sons which I have given my Land to should die before they come of Age or Lawful Age that the surviving party may have all my Land
- Item* I give & bequeath to my Wife Sarah May Bay mare also one Womans Saddle also Six plates two dishes one Basin one Iron Pot one Chest one Porringer one Wheal Cards also half of the Cotten the other part to my Daughter Rachel Studevant I also give my Wife one sow & pigs one Cow and gear two Sheep also my Negro Man despatching her life or widowhood and then to my son Thomas Hardie and his heirs forever My Will is that all my Estate not heretofore mentioned may be sold to discharge my debts and if any thing remains over after all my debts is paid my desire is then

is shall be equally divided between my Daughter & Rachel Stewart and my Grandson John Blanton to them of their Heire forever &c.

I Give & Bequeath to my Son Richard Hardie & wife of my Estate as he has in his possession also my wearing Apparel to him and his heirs forever I Constitute and appoint my son William Hardie Executor with my wife & late Hardie Executors of this my last Will & Testament In Witness whereof Theresunto set my Hand & Seal the day & year above written &c
