my Hand & affixed my Seal this 5th Day of May 1773

Item I Give & Bequeath to my Son in Law James Mason and to his Heirs forever the following Slaves Rose Cynthia Man Milly & Bob together with their future Increase

Item I Give & Bequeath to my Son Mr. Harrison & his Heirs forever my Land in Surry County & my Leases for Colledge Land also the following Slaves goods & Chattels viz. Michael Jerry Jack Jacob Moses & Gilly & her four Children Winny Will Anthony & Milly Absalom Peg Betty Ben Diana Jable Buzgo Nan & three Children Betty Hannah & Pat all my Stock of Cattle & Hogs Cattle head of Sheep the Bay mare salt six dishes twelve hand metal Plates and Dishes one chest two pots one pan one Copper Kettle one Still all my Carpenter & Cooper's Tools a Cupboard a Bed & Sheet together with the Increase of said Slaves given to him & his Heirs forever.

Item I Give & Bequeath to my Daughter Lucy Atkins the following Slaves named Phil & Pat how Death to be equally divided between her Children John & Martha Atkins also one Bed & Sheet.

Item I Give & Bequeath to my Grandson John Atkins & to his Heirs forever the following Slaves Tarza provided he should either be married or arrive to the age of eighteen but in case of Failure in each then the said Slaves Tarza shall be the Property of my Granddaughter Martha Atkins if she be alive but if not then the said Slaves Tarza shall be equally divided among my Children Mary Peoples Lucy Atkins William Harrison & my Grandson John Mason.

Item I Give & Bequeath to my Granddaughter Martha Atkins the following Slaves Tanny & Annica & to her Heirs forever provided she should either marry or arrive at the age of eighteen but in case of Failure in each then the said Slaves shall be the Property of my Grandson John Atkins if he be living & if not they shall be equally between my Children Mary Peoples Lucy Atkins William Harrison & my Grandson John Mason.

It is also my Desire that no part of my Estate be appraised & otherwise I desire that my Children Mary Peoples Lucy Atkins & William Harrison shall each of them have one fourth Part of my Slaves Goods or Chattels not above given or bequeathed & the Children left by Daughter Betty Mason lately deceased the others fourth Part equally divided among them. It is further my Desire that my Son in Law James Mason have during his Life the two of the Part left to his Children.

Lastly I nominate & appoint my Son in Law Thomas Peoples & my Son William Harrison my whole & sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament.

Item I leave to my Wife Mary Battle during her natural Life my Negroes
Bristol Jacob Pat & Lenny two ^{half} Beds and furniture one Chest one painted
& trunk two Iron Potts one frying Pan half my Stock of Cattle Hogs & Sheep
one Horse or Mare the Choice of all my Stock of Horses and at the Death
of my Wife Mary Battle the Negroes I leave her during her Life I give to be
equally divided between my Daughters Lydia Battle & my Grandson
Jordan Richardson the Stock & Household Goods to my Daughter Lydia
