

& Colony of Virginia being Sick & Weak in Body but of sound Mind & understanding do constitute & appoint this my last Will of Testament.  
In witness whereof I commend my Soul into the Hands of Almighty God who gave it and my  
Body to the Dust from whence it came Humbly hoping for a Resurrection to  
Eternal Life through Jesus Christ my Blessed Lord & Redeemer.  
Item It is my Desire that my Executor here after to be named pay all my just debts  
as soon as conveniently may be out of such part of my Estate as he shall think proper.  
Item I Give & Bequeath to my dear Daughter Ann Crowder the whole of  
my Estate that I shall die possessed of or Intitled to whether real or personal  
of what kind or quantity whatsoever it may be declining to give any part thereof  
to my Dear Son Charles Barlow in Consideration of his being already well  
provided for; his late Father William Barlow having by his will left him much  
the largest part of his Estate.  
Lastly I hereby appoint my Son in Law Mathew Crowder Sole Executor to this my  
last Will of Testament.

At a Court held for Suffolk County the 17<sup>th</sup> day of March 1774.  
The last Will of Testament of Nathaniel Young deceased was presented into

Exe. intend into & Acknowledged their Bond for his due performance of what the Court  
doth require.

In the Name of God Amen. I Thomas Atkinson of the Parish of Albermarle  
of County of Suffolk being sick of Weak in Body but of perfect mind & desirous  
Memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same do make & ordain this my  
last Will of Testament in manner & form following, that is to say, first of  
principally I Bequeath my Soul into the Hands of Almighty God who gave it  
me and my Body I commit to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like  
manner and for my worldly Estate I give & dispose of the same in manner &  
form following Viz.

Item I Give of Bequest to my Son Joel Atkinson the Land & plantation whereon I now  
live containing three hundred & ninety five Acres. I say I give it to him & his  
Heirs of Assigns forever. I also Give of devise to my said Son Joel Atkinson &  
to his Heirs of Assigns forever my Negroe man Bobb.

Item I Give of devise to my Son Abram Atkinson my Negroe man Ned to him & his  
Heirs of Assigns forever.

Item I Give of Devise to my Daughter Elizabeth Prince Wife of William Prince  
and her Heirs of Assigns forever my Negro Boy Davis.

Item I Give of Devise to my Daughter Mary Atkinson my Negro Girl Syntha & her  
Heirs - Assigns forever. I also give my said Daughter Mary Atkinson  
one to her.

Item I Give of Devise to my Daughter Lydia Atkinson & to her Heirs of Assigns  
forever one feather Bed & furniture also one to her known by the Name of  
her Mother.

Item I Give to my Daughter Frances Adams via shilling down Money of  
Virginia.
