after my decease and the money arising after my Just Debts and
Funeral Expenses are paid I give the use of to my Beloved Wife during
her Natural Life or WidowhoodAlso. I bequeath to my said Wife Agnes the use of my whole Estate both real &
Personal of what kind or property and wheresoever found during her
Natural Life or Widowhood. and after her death or Marriage my Will
of desire is that all the said Estate so lent may be equally divided
between my surviving Children share & share alikeAnd I do appoint my Loving Wife Agnes & my Son Miles Duncan
Executors of this my last Will & Testament. and the said Estate may
not be Appraised. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
