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In the name of god amen I Phillip Harwood of Sussex County being sound of memory and calling to mind human frailty do make and ordain this my last Will and testament in manner and form as followeth, first I give my soul to God who gave it me in humble hopes of a blessed immortality through the redemption that is in Jesus Christ And my body to mingle with fellow clay untill the Morning of the resurrection, And ~~my~~ worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me I give and bestow in manner and form followeth, First, I desire that my debts and funeral expenses be well and truly paid.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand daughter, Sarah Long one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand daughter Ann Bell Harwood the land and plantation wherein her father Phillip Harwood did live containing one hundred and eighty acres more or less and is bound as followeth beginning at a pine on William Longbottoms line and thence by a line of my own making to Forts line, and so along the said Forts line to the poplar swamp and down the swamp to Longbottoms line and so to the beginning to her and the heirs of her body, but in case she should die without such heir I desire the said ^{land} and plantation may ascend to my son Daniel Harwood and his heirs forever.

Item All the rest and remainder of my estate with the land and plantation now live on, I lend unto my loving wife Rebecca during her natural life and at her decease I desire the said lands as well as all the said remainder of my estate may descend unto my son Daniel Harwood his heirs and assigns forever.

Lastly I appoint my wife Rebecca, Executrix and my son Daniel, Executor of this my last Will and testament ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this nineteenth day of June in the year of our lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy six.

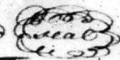
