 one thousand seven hundred and seventy seven. I Seth Mose of Sussex County, being
 sick of body but of good and perfect memory thanks be to Almighty God. and calling
 to remembrance the uncertain estate of this transitory life and that all flesh must
 yield unto death when it shall please God to call. do make and declare this my
 last Will and Testament in manner and form following, first being penitent and
 sorry for all my sins most humbly desiring forgiveness of the same I commend my
 soul unto almighty god my saviour and redeemer in whom and by whose Merits
 I trust and believe assuredly to be saved and to have full remission and forgiveness
 of all my sins, and to inherit the Kingdom of heaven. And my body I commit to
 the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named.
 And for the settling of my temporal estate and such goods, Chattels and Debts as it
 hath pleased God, to bestow upon me. I do order and give and dispose the same in
 manner and form following. That is to say.

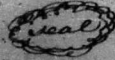
First I Will and positively order that the whole of my estate of all and every kind whatever.
 except my negroe boy Jordon. be sold and the money arising therefrom or by means
 thereof. be equally divided amongst my dear beloved Brothers, Ephraim Mose, John
 Mose and my beloved Sisters, Sarah Wynn and Susanna Mose to them and their
 heirs.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my dear beloved Mother during her Widowhood my Negroe
 boy Jordon, and after decease or Marriage of my Mother, my desire is that my said
 negroe Jordon be sold and divided as aforesaid amongst my Brothers and Sisters
 equally.

Item. Lastly I constitute, nominate and appoint my beloved Brother Ephraim Mose
 full and sole executor of this my last Will and Testament. Hereby revoking
 annulling and making void all other and former Wills and bequests by me made.
 And declaring this only to be my last Will and Testament In Testimony
 whereof the Testator hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal.

Imprimis, I give unto my loving wife Elizabeth Nicholson during her Widowhood my college plantation and at her death or marriage to my son William Nicholson.

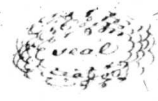
Item I lend to my said wife my negroe man Peter during her Widowhood.

Item I desire my executors hereafter named may raise from my other estate all the money that they can (leaving necessities for my wife and children) and the money so raised to be by them laid out in young negroe women, and my wife to have the use of the said negroe or negroes during her widowhood and at her death or marriage, to be with the above mentioned estate, equally divided amongst my then living children. Provided that any of my children do marry and have children, and so depart this life before my said wife that the said children at my wifes death or marriage shall be entitled to their father or mothers part of the said estate.

Lastly, I do constitute nominate and appoint my loving wife my brother William Nicholson and Richard Andrews Executors of this my last Will and Testament, to whom I also give the Guardianship of my children and my desire is that my estate be not appraised. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal the day and year above written.
