Wm. Chisholme junr. Esq;

I Benjamin Hancock of Sussex County being as well as usual both in body & Mind but at the same time not knowing how soon I shall die do make & appoint this to be my last Will & Testament in manner & form as followeth —

- 1<sup>st</sup>. I give & Bequeath to my son John Hancock and to his heirs forever the land & plantation which I purchased of John Justhins in Sussex County containing by Patent two hundred and ninety eight acres be the same more or less together with one negroe girl called Danner, one feather bed and furniture & two cows & Calves.
- 2<sup>d</sup>. I give & Bequeath to my son James Hancock the land and plantation wherein I now dwell containing two hundred and few acres be the same more or less to him & his heirs forever provided he shall live to the age of twenty one years or be married before given to my said son James and to his heirs forever one negroe girl named Rose & twenty five pounds current money.
- 3<sup>rd</sup>. I give & Bequeath to my son Samuel Hancock One negroe boy called Moses, ten pounds current money & in case my above named son James Hancock should die before he arrives to the age of twenty one years or be married the land & plantation which I have herein devised to him, to him my said son Samuel & his heirs forever.

4<sup>th</sup>. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Selah Hancock & to her heirs forever one Negroe girl called Kate & twenty pounds current money —

5<sup>th</sup>. I give & Bequeath to my son Stephen Hancock twenty shillings cash.

6<sup>th</sup>. After my just debts & legacies are paid I desire that all the remaining part
