Item I Give unto my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Kinn, Daughter of my Son Thomas Kinn one Negro Girl called Suwanah to her & her Kins forever.

with all their increase Sarah & Fanny to her & her heirs forever —

- Item My Will & devise is, that my Just Debts be paid out of the part of my Estate that I have given the use of to my wife during her Life or Widowhood (the Land of Negro Girl Lane & her increase excepted) and that my Executors shall have full power & Authority to Sell any part they think most convenient to discharge the same out of the part before by me devised.
- Item I Give unto my Daughter Olive Tomlinson the following Negroes with their Increase from the date hereof (anny & little Phillis to her & her Heirs forever. Also the use of the Negro Girl Jane & her Increase after the Death of my Wife during her natural Life or Widowhood) and after the Death of my wife, and death or widowhood of my Daughter Olive Tomlinson I Give the Negro Girl Lane and all her Increase from the date hereof to be equally divided between the Children that my Daughter Olive has alive by her Husband Thom. Tomlinson to them & their Heirs forever.
- Item I Give unto my Sons Barbara & David Kinco all my Estate of what nature or kind soever not heretofore devised after my Just debts be paid out of the same, & the Death or Widowhood of my Wife Elizabeth Kinco to be equally divided between them to them & their Heirs forever.

And I do hereby appoint my Son William Kinco & my Son in Law John Schappell whole & Sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament and further direct that my Estate shall not be Appraised in to drops.

In the Name of God Amen the th 23 day of August in the Year of our Lord & King One thousand ^{seven hundred &} twenty I Rollo Day Fort of Sussex County being Sick & weak but of sound & disposing Mind & Memory thanks be to almighty God for the same & calling to mind the certainty of Death & the uncertainty of this transitory life do make complete & ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner following that is to say first & principally I recommend my Soul into the Hands of Almighty God who gave it me, Hope & believe in my blessed Redeemer Jesus Christ for Salvation and as for my Body I recommend it to the Earth to be decently Buried at the discretion of my Executors here after named and as for my worldly Goods wherewith ^{both} I please God to bless me with I Give & dispose of in manner following.
