In the Name of God Amen I Robert Allway of the Parish of Albemarle and County of Sussex being sick but of a sound disposing mind and Memory do make and ordain this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all Wills heretofore made by me &c. In premiss my Will and desire is that first and foremost of all my just Debts be paid and my Body decently buried at the discretion of my Executors.

Item I bequeath unto my Loving wife all my Estate during the time she continues my Widow to bring up and Educate my Children upon and Finish the House we now live in and also to build any other Necessary buildings for the use of the plantation But upon her marriage And her the use of my Negroes Sarah, Nancy, Sami, Oak, Young Jimmy, & Son, and at her death to be Equally divided with their Increase among my Children that shall then be living or their legal representatives I also give my beloved wife at the determination of her Widowhood her side Saddle or if that should be nearly worn out I give her Twelve Pounds Current money of Virginia to buy her one, also one Horse or Mare choice of all my Stock Ten head of Cattle from one year old & upwards one Good Leather Bed & Furniture all the Red Leather Trunks in the House and one small Gent^l Skin Trunk Six Pewter Dishes and Twelve Pewter Plates also one Pine Chest called her Hest.

Item I give and Devise unto my Son William the Land and Plantation whereon I now live and my Silver Table Spoons to him and his Heirs and Assigns for ever Provided he pay to the Child my wife now goes with if a Son the Sum of Four hundred Pounds Current money of Virginia when the Child Arrives to the Age of Twenty one Years or marriage.

Item if the Child my wife now goes with be a son then I give him my Plantation Odown Nottoway River containing Three hundred and thirty Six Acres which said plantation is to be broke up and Rented to some low Tenant to take Care of the Houses till he comes of age Also four hundred Pounds Current money of Virginia to be paid him by my son William and if my said Son William should fail or refuse to pay him the said Unborn Son the said Sum of Four hundred Pounds then I give him one half of the Plantation during my son William to him and his Heirs and Assigns for ever also my Silver Tea Spoons and my
