In the Name of God Amen, I William Lofsten of the County of Sussex being sick and weak but of sound disposing mind and memory do make this my last Will and testament in manner and form following.

Impresid, I give and bequeath unto my son William Lofsten the land and plantation whereon he now lives being all that town on the North side of the Little swamp to him and his heirs forever,

Item. I give and bequeath unto my son Burrell Lofsten all my land on the south side of the Little swamp, together with my mill and plantation and all that appertain thereto, to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son William Lofsten one negroe man Named Quimby after the death of my wife to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Frederick Lofsten one negroe man named Harvis after the death of my wife to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rebecka Lofsten one negroe named Sall after the death of my wife to her and her heirs forever,

1771 I give and bequeath unto my daughter Phoebe Moore one negroe named Tom after the death of my wife to her and her heirs forever

1771 I give and bequeath unto my daughter Martha Soaburn three negroes named Jan and her Child Willie and put to her and her heirs forever.

1771 I give and bequeath unto my son Burrill Softin the following negroes Judy, Bran, Sarah Phillis and Abb, after the death of my wife to him and his heirs forever.

1771 I have unto my beloved wife Mary Softin the plantation whereon I now live with all my household and kitchen furniture, plantation utensils all the stock of all kinds and all my Negroes, (except the three given to my daughter Martha) during her natural life and after her death to go as above mentioned My Will and desire is that the stock of all kinds and household furniture, plantation utensils &c. after the death of my Wife may be equally divided between my three sons William, Burrill & Frederick and their heirs forever.

I do nominate and appoint my three sons above mentioned my whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament as Witnesses my hand this 15th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy seven.

Item I give and bequeath to my dear Sister Huldah Wron one Gray horse or his Value in money to be made out of my personal estate.

Item I give and bequeath to my dear Sister Molly Weathers ten pounds current money of Virginia to be made out of my estate.

Item I give and bequeath to my dear Sister Sally Wron five pounds current money of Virginia to be made out of my estate.

Item I give and bequeath to my dear loving father one negroe fellow namely Jack of my servit colt Wilks.

Item And the over plus of my estate to be equally divided amongst my five sisters, namely Hannah Perch, and Sarah Bendall, Anna Perch, Huldah Wron and Molly Weathers, after paying first my debts and Legacies.

Lastly I Do hereby constitute and appoint my Father Thomas Wron and Joseph Williamson whole and sole Executors to this my last Will and Testament, In Witness whereunto I have set my hand and seal this 23<sup>d</sup> day of March 1777.
