 ers as above named may have an equal part thereof which I
 give to them their Heirs Executors Administrators & assigns forever (1813)
 the part that I have appointed to each.

 good I wish at her death what is left of sd. Estate to be equally divided
 amongst all my children viz. Sarah, William, John, Lockhart, Isaac
 Lockhart, Polly, McGuire, Jane, Betshor & Daniel Lockhart.

And I do hereby utterly disclaim revoke and disannul all former Wills
 by me at any time heretofore made and declared this and no other
 to be my last Will and Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and seal this twenty seventh day of November in the
 year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen. 1815.
