and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, but being
uncertain of the time thereof, do therefore make this my last Will
and Testament, That is to say first and principally, I bequeath my Soul to
God who gave it and my Body to the earth there to be decently buried
according to the discretion of my Executors. And as for the worldly
Estate wherewith it has pleased the Lord to bless me, I dispose of
the same in manner following. I then I give and bequeath unto my
well beloved Son Richard Oney the whole of the Land & Plantation
whereon I now live, as also some kind of Stock of Horses and cattle
I also like all my household furniture & cash that I have & of
that I may die possessed of in consideration of the said Richard
Oney paying the debt of Expenses hereafter mentioned, Viz. to my well
beloved Son Joseph Oney the Sum of twenty Shillings, to my well
beloved Son William Oney the Sum of twenty Shillings, to my Son
in law William Webb the Sum of twenty Shillings, to my Son in law
William Stapleton the Sum of twenty Shillings, to my Son in law Cha-
les Smith the Sum of twenty Shillings. And in consideration of the
of the dutiful affection of my said son Richard Oney and of his ten-
der & good behaviour in his constantly abiding with us in our old age and
by his remarkable industry in procuring for us all a competency of this
world's goods, I do most freely and sincerely bequeath the whole of my real and
personal Estate to him and his heirs for ever as before received, and I
most heartily desire that no contention may be made to any clause in this
Will to deprive him of any part of my aforesaid Estate. I do hereby
constitute and appoint my said son Richard Oney, my Executor &
my beloved wife Mary, Executrix of this my last Will and Testament &
do hereby acknowledge this and no other to be my last Will & Testament
