I David Ward of Fazwell County, and State of Virginia being
 in perfect health of both body and mind but calling to mind my
 advanced age and the uncertainty of life in every period thereof
 I do hereby make and ordain this my last will and testament, in the
 manner and form following viz. I give to my wife Eleanor Ward one
 third part of the plantation wherein I now live, containing by estimate
 about two acres one third of the improvement on said land together
 with dwelling house and all the other buildings on said improvement
 I wish to remain in the possession of my wife during the term of her
 natural life, to be enjoyed by her without interruption or molestation
 and at my wife's decease my will is that the said 400 acres of land with
 the appurtenances be considered as equally the property of Isaac Ward,
 Luram Ward, and Addison Ward to be by them enjoyed as co-heirs to
 them their heirs or assigns forever. I give unto my son Rees Ward
 a tract of land adjoining the said tract of 400 acres, which by estimate
 contains about 100 acres, and has been usually called Isaac Moore
 Ridge this tract is to be divided from the 400 acre tract by a line begin-
 ning at a white oak marked R.W. standing between the road and
 the creek above the ford next to John Brooks and to run somewhere
 more or less north west corner a straight line to a stake in the hollow 100 yards
 above the spring commonly called the maple spring and to extend
 on the same course till it intersects the line of George Grubb and
 along Grubb line to the line of William Ward and along the
 several courses of the same ground to the beginning to be held by the
 said Rees Ward as his legal property to him his heirs or assigns forever
 I also give unto my wife Eleanor Ward one third part of my personal
 Estate and my just debts are paid and is to be considered as her
 absolute property and to be disposed by her at her decease by will
 or in whatever she may think proper. And as to the balance of
 my personal Estate should any thing remain after my debts are
 paid, I wish it to be equally divided to be made among my four daughters
 my sons Luram Ward, Henry Ward, Phoebe Ward & Malinda Ward. And
 whereas some of my daughters may have acquired some small
 personal property by their own industry since the came to full age,
 if that has been the case I do not wish to consider that as any
 part of my personal estate, but only such as has been obtained
 by me before my daughters came to mature age.
 My will also is that as long as my sons are so far under age that
 they have not been educated as I caused my desire is, that my
 wife my son Isaac and all my daughters should contribute according
 to their abilities to have my four daughters some taught Reading writing
 and Arithmetic so as to enable them to do common business - And
 lastly I hereby constitute and appoint my wife Eleanor
