147.3 I Dudley Young of Saxe-well County and State of Virginia do hereby make my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say: First) I desire that all my Horses be immediately be sold after my decease, and out of the monies arising therefrom all my just Debts and funeral expences be paid.

2nd After the payment of my just Debts and funeral expences I give to Israel Youngs wife Lervicia and Charles (Youngs wife) Margaret each of them fifteen Dollars.

3rd) The Balance of my Estate both real and personal of what nature or kind it may be not here before disposed of except my negro

Dudley Man, I desire may equally be divided among my four relations Charles Young, Israel Young, Nathaniel Young and David Young.

Will 4th I wish my negro Will to have the choise of either of the above named Israel Young, Nathaniel Young or Charles Young to serve and farther that he shall not be exalted fully to the height of his value in order that he during good behaviour may have some indulgence, the price then arising to be equally divided betwixt the above Israel Young, Charles Young and Nathaniel Young.

In the name of God, amen I James Thompson of the County Tazewell and Commonwealth of Virginia being sick and weak body but of a mind sufficient to transact my business and calling to mind the uncertainty of life and the certainty of Death and that it hath been appointed unto all men once to die and as to such worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me in this life I part from and dispose of as follows I first Will and bequeath unto James Doak Thompson (being the illegitimate child had by James Doak) my plantation in the County of Tazewell called Mucedemus with all the land I have adjoining the same to him and his heirs forever also my negrow boy by the name of Isaac in like manner forever the land and negrow to be delivered to him when he arrives twenty one years.

Secondly Will and bequeath to George Washington Thompson being the illegitimate child I had by Sally Justice my plantation called Kinges with all the adjoining lands to this tract which I possess also my negrow John being the child of woman Sephira forever the negrow and Land to be delivered him when he arrives at the age of twenty one years by my Executors.

Thirdly I will and bequeath to my dearly beloved mother my negrow Leas during the life of my said mother and after her death to pass as follows hereafter.

Fourthly I will and bequeath Rachel Doak my sister negrow girl called Judy which is at James Siffaney hired after her term is out forever I also will and bequeath her the work of my negrow boy called Nelson for the term of fifteen years years and then for him to pass as hereafter bequeathed.

Fifthly I will and bequeath to Lydia Doak my sister my negrow girl called Rachel to her forever and request of my said sister she never may be abused or sold.

Sixthly I will and bequeath to my brother William Thompson the following Slaves, Joseph, George, and Unica, also my negrow woman Leas after the Death of my mother and my negrow boy Nelson after the period he is to serve Rachel Doak is expired.
