I George Perry of Saywell County and State of Virginia do hereby make this my last will and testament in and to wit as follows (viz) to my loving daughter I give my negro woman Jane during her life and after her decease to be sold and the money divided amongst my nine daughters I also bequeath to my wife her beds and furniture and such household and kitchen furniture as she may think proper to retain also one hundred dollars the balance of my personal estate as soon as convenient after my decease to be sold and the money arising therefrom after paying my debts to be divided equally amongst my nine daughters Rebecca Thompson, Polly Gibson, Mary Mus, Martha C. Carroll, Peggy Hall, Jane Witten, Elizabeth Perry, Camala Gibson, Abba Rutledge having decided away that part of my land intended for my sons Andrew and John as to them I be-

nothing more to bequeath them the tract of land on which I live I intended for my 2d Joseph but in consequence of his having traded away his claim to Jonathan Peery, I now bequeath the said tract of land to said Jonathan Peery.

And lastly I do hereby appoint Ambrose Hall and Jonathan Peery Executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other or former wills or testaments by me made or made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 27th. of May 1830

The last will and testament of George Peery deceased was proven according to law, by the oaths of Milton E. Moore & James M. Peery, witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the Motion of Ambrose Hall and Jonathan Peery Executors therein named who made oath thereto and together with John Davidson, Henry Bowers, William Taylor & Robert W. Davidson their securities, entered into an acknowledgment this bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, which certificate is granted them for obtaining probate thereof.

In the name of God amen. I James Carter being at this time weak in body, but of sound mind and disposing memory, calling to mind the mortality of my body and believing it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain

this my last Will and Testament in the following manner and form to wit, first I desire that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner at the discretion of the of my Executors hereafter named, and after my just debts and funeral expenses are paid, I bequeath unto my daughter Catherine French and the heirs of her body one Cow, one horse, four sheep, one bed and bed clothes, one oven and pot to be enjoyed and possessed by her the said Catherine and the heirs of her body forever. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rebecca French one toll to be paid out of my Estate. I now and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth the remainder of my personal Estate including every description thereof so long as she remains my widow but if she should die in any again, it is then my will, that the property be sold and after she gets her part thereof that the balance be given to my daughter Rebecca French and there be no other heirs, but in case there should be no other, then it is my will, that there should be equal shares.

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Catherine French and the heirs of her body a part of the tract of land whereon I live it being the western part thereof lying next to the Valley ridge a piece ofly to the conditional line made and marked out by Samuel Carter and Abram Carison at the request of the said James Carter, which part is also known and distinguished by the name of the Kumb place to be enjoyed and possessed by her and the heirs of her body forever, I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife the other part of the plantation whereon I live including the mansion house and other buildings so long as
