I James Witten surgeon of Squabble Creek and State of Virginia being seized to dispose of all my estate both real and personal in manner and form that is to say I do give that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid out of my estate as I shall hereafter direct by my executors which I shall direct.

2nd I give to my Son Samuel Witten a tract of land on which he now lives and which is valued to him at one thousand dollars and other property to the amount of one hundred and fifty dollars.

3rd I give to my Son William Witten a tract of land on which he now lives one part of which is known by the name of the middle tract and the other which I purchased of Thomas and Crockett was part of the tract I now live on beginning at a white oak in a space of the Creek being the corner of the piece here last before named then running to the top of the said ridge and with the ridge to my farm and thence to a

post mark the line of the tract and thence to the head of a hollow opposite Quarters creek and with the hollow to the road and end then a straight line to a white oak the beginning corner of the middle tract and which is valued to him at one thousand dollars and other property to the amount of one hundred and

seventy dollars 4th I give to my son Thomas Witten one horse and one lead to the amount of one hundred and forty dollars and one thousand and thirty dollars more at my and my wife's death if my estate will admit of it 5th I give to my daughter Lempy Crockett property to the amount of two hundred and forty eight dollars and nine pence and twenty two

dollars more at my and my wife's death if my estate will admit of it 6th I give to my daughter Dorothy Quinn property to the amount of five hundred and forty dollars and six hundred and thirty dollars more at mine and my

wife's death if my estate will admit of it 7th I give to my daughter Charles Quinn property to the amount of two hundred and thirty dollars and nine pence and twenty two dollars more at mine and my wife's death if my estate will admit of it 8th I give to my daughter Eliza Quinn property to the amount of two hundred

dollars and one dollar more if demanded at mine and my wife's death 9th I give to my daughter Matilda Thompson property to the amount of two hundred and sixty eight dollars and nine pence and twenty two dollars more at my and my

wife's death if my estate will admit of it

10th I give to my son James Witten the plantation I now live on with the exception of the part I gave to William Witten and a young boy and

11th I give that all my Real and personal Estate and not herebefore mentioned horse and Cattle and Farming Implements and public possessions on this plantation to my wife Matilda Witten during her life Lastly I constitute and appoint Samuel Witten and William Thompson Executors to this my last will and testament signed in the presence and before me as for the last will and testament of James Witten surgeon in presence of us this 22 day of April 1821

 I give to my Son Joseph Harrison one dollar to be paid out of my estate
 I give to my Son Samuel Harrison one dollar to be paid out of my estate
 I give to my Son Emily Harrison one dollar to be paid out of my estate
 I give to the heirs of my daughter Mary Gillispie one dollar to be discharged out of my estate
 13th The balance of my estate shall be equally divided between my sons
 Thomas and Alexander and my daughter Mary Harrison
 14th and one dollar to my three sons Joseph Samuel and Emily Harrison
 Heirs of my daughter Mary Gillispie in which case last her heirs may
 be discharged out of my estate
 And Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Thomas Harrison
 Executor of this my last will and testament, hereby making also the said
 Thomas my sole and true heir and my sole and true executor
