First of all I order my lawful debts to be payed Secondly I having already Deeded the most of my Land to my sons Elisha and Joseph I order that they support and keep my wife Esterson Cumpton furnishing her with every thing needful for her comfort during her life furnishing with a good horse saddle and bridle so she may find her self on a Negro woman named Rose to work on here at all times I leave one Negro man named Peter to my son William I leave one Negro man named Isaac to my son Elisha also a negro girl named Nancy I leave to my son Joseph one negro man named Henry and one negro woman named Phillis I leave to my son Herman a negro man named Dennis I leave to my son Reckman one negro man named Jacob I leave to my son Elisha one good Wagon and all her harness I leave to my son Joseph an old Wagon I leave to my sons Elisha and Joseph a still I leave to my son John the within tract of Land as follows

Commencing at the mouth of a branch called the big Branch running a north course toward the mill called the Ambrosing that end of my Survey embracing the mill called the Falls of Bladens into a tract of Ninety Two Acres lying between the above named Falls and Long Ridge The Remainder of the above named Survey embracing all my Land in the big bottom except that already devised I leave to my sons William Elisha and Joseph to be divided into three equal parts and the above named William Elisha and Joseph are each to find his part by ballot I give to my daughter a Nancy Cartwal Ten Dollars to my Daughter Rebecca Shannon Ten Dollars to my daughter Esterson Brown Ten Dollars to my daughter Sally Cumpton Ten Dollars to be Paid out of the Estate of Elisha and Joseph and Lastly I appoint John B.
