I bequeath an equal share of if one tract of land in the rich mountain
contains 250 acres and likewise an equal share of 515 acres
of land in the back valley to be the residue of a tract of 665 acres
in which Mary has her share.

Item Unto my two sons John and William I bequeath one dollar each
they having received their share before.

Item Unto my son James I bequeath one dollar having received his share before.

Item Unto my son Robert I will and bequeath the land I now live on
and a small tract lying between the tract I live on and James R.
