 Whereas I James M^d Neely a free white male of the County of Taywell and State of Virginia in Buckles garden ~~dec~~ hereby make this my last will and testament as follows, first all bequeath and recommend my soul to God the maker and giver of it to me, secondly I desire that my administrator take all my personal property, have it appraised and sold according to law and pay my funeral expenses and all my just debt out of the monies arising therefrom also to collect all monies or other property that I may be entitled to, to settle my two school-articles and receive the due accordingly all my books and other accounts, Thirdly I desire that my administrator give unto George Thompson my servant man that I purchased from him if he will take her for to discharge the debt which ~~gave~~ him for said man of not to sell her as the other property and pay said debt, which is 50 - fourthly - I desire that my administrator after paying himself and settling said Estate justly ~~dec~~ give unto Miss Torrey some one third part of the money that may be in his hands, Fifthly I desire that my administrator after settling as aforesaid put the other two thirds of the monies in his hands out at lawful interest, which monies with I interest he will give unto Miss Grundy Spunkells, eldest son that she has now at this time whenever he may have attained the age of twenty one years or sooner if he should get married, Sixthly I desire again and appoint James M^d Neely my administrator to attend to and settle my estate as aforesaid, In Witness whereof I have this 12th day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty five signed my name and affixed my seal in the presence of George Speaker
