I will and bequeath William Mitchell my bay mare called Boney and her yearling colt also I will and bequeath Thomas Mitchell my black mare three two Devisees being the son of Anna Mitchell - And all the rest of any horses and boxes I will and bequeath my brother William Thompson.

I will and bequeath James P. Thompson the son of Archibald Thompson a negro girl the child of Caesar called Phillips forever and so hereby revoke all former wills by me heretofore made constituting this my only last free will and Testament.

And I further constable and appoint my half brother Archibald Thompson and my brother William Thompson Executors of this my last will and Testament the witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my seal and signed the same with my own hand.

151. I James Peery Son of the County of Fazwell and State of Virginia do hereby make my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say
1st. I give unto my living Children that is Nancy Bandy, Samuel Peery, William Peery Nelly Whitman & James Peery Hannah Peery and Michael Peery all the money that I have on hand to be divided in the following way
that is to say to be equally divided among them all and my daughter Nancy Bandy and my son Michael Peery part is to remain in the hands of my Executors, and to be paid to them in the following way my daughter Nancy Bandy is to receive her part in four annual payments, and my son Michael Peery to be paid in seven annual payments and the first payment to be made within one month after my Death.

2nd. I give to my Daughter Nelly Whitman my Negro Girl Sally.

3rd. I give to my daughter Hannah Peery my young best horse saddle and bridle, my room and gears, my square table and three chairs, and little school and check rock, and puts two horses and one shetel all of the same kind also one large sugar Kettle and one large pot, sixteen Geese one bed and furniture, and bedsteads and my Bureau also my Negro girl Betsy, and three breeding sows, & 2 heifers and three Cows & one hog, my bed & furniture.

4th. I give to my son William Peery my old tract of land whereon now lies containing two hundred and twenty seven acres, my brown herd and the timber which all the horn gees and plows that on the place also two of other heads one cold his are the other the white head, with there furniture except a rug which I allow to Nancy Bandy.

5th. I leave to my son fat Peery John Crookett receives for two hundred and fifty Dollars which I paid him for my son James.

6th. I give to my son in law John Crookett my rifle gun.

7th. I give to my grand sons Addison Crookett my silver Watch.

8th. I give to my three living daughters all my wife clothes to be divided in three equal parts and for my daughter Hannah to have choice of lots.

9th. I leave to my three grand children John, Rufus and Robert Crookett fifty Dollars each to be paid out of my estate towards educating them.

10th. I give my negro woman Nancy to my three daughters Nancy Bandy, Nelly Whitman and Hannah Peery for her to live with each of them three weeks.

15th D. I. agid them to make her choice of which of the three she will live with and for the other two to be paid by the one the Negro making choice of as a mifteip and hundred & sixteen dollars and sixty seven cents each & in case the one chosen by Nancy for a mifteip refuses to pay for her she is to have a second choice and if none of them will take her she must be sold and the money equally divided among the three.

And all the rest of my estate both real and personal I allow to be sold by my Executors herein after named and to be equally divided among my Legatees which I give to them & their heirs &c. forever excepting my son William Peery & if he should ever intermarry or take up with Peggy or Margaret Chaffin after my Death then and in that case he is only to have the lands and property that is particularly named to him and no more, and I also except my brown horse if he marries as above stated he is not to have him but he is to be sold and divided as the other property — And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Samuel Peery and John Crockett my Executor of this my last Will and Testament further revoking all other former Wills or Testaments Peery's ^{by me hereinafore made.}
