In the name of God, a man I James Thompson of the County Tazewell and Commonwealth of Virginia being sick and weak body but of a mind sufficient to transact my business, and calling to mind the uncertainty of life and the certainty of Death and that it hath been appointed unto all men once to die and as to such worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bestow in this life I part from and dispose of as follows first Will and bequeath unto James Doak Thompson (being the illegitimate child had by Jean Doak) my plantation in the County of Tazewell called Mucedunnes with all the land I have adjoining the same to him and his heirs forever also my negro boy by the name of Sam in like manner forever the land and negro to be delivered to him when he arrives twenty one years.

Secondly Will and bequeath to George Washington Thompson being the illegitimate child I had by Sally Justice my plantation called Kinges with all the adjoining lands to this tract which I possess also my negro John being the child of woman Ephiea forever the negro and land to be delivered him when he arrives at the age of twenty one years by my Executors.

Thirdly I will and bequeath to my dear beloved mother my negro Leas during the life of my said mother and after her death to pass as follows hereafter.

Fourthly I will and bequeath Rachel Doak my sister negro girl called Judy which is at James Jeffaney hired after her term is out forever I also will and bequeath her the work of my negro boy called Nelson for the term of fifteen years years and then for him to pass as hereafter bequeathed.

Fifthly I will and bequeath to Lydia Doak my sister my negro girl called Rachel to her forever and request of my said sister she never may be abused or sold.

Sixthly I will and bequeath to my brother William Thompson the following slaves, Joseph, George, and Lincoln, also my negro woman Leas after the Death of my mother and my negro boy Nelson after the period he is to serve Rachel Doak is expired.

150. I will and bequeath to William Thompson the son of my brother William my negro boy Abraham for ever.
I also will and bequeath brother Alexander Thompson my negro woman Sophia forever.

I will and bequeath Sister Rachel Quak two cows.

I will and bequeath William Mitchell my boy mare called Boney and her yearling colt also I will and bequeath Thomas Mitchell my black mare then two Drovers being the sons Annas Mitchell - And also the rest of my horses and cows I will and bequeath my brother William Thompson.

I will and bequeath James B. Thompson the son of Archibald Thompson a negro girl the child of Leise called Phillis forever and I hereby revoke all former wills by me heretofore made constituting this my only last free will and Testament.

And I further constitute and appoint my half brother Archibald Thompson and my brother William Thompson Executors of this my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my seal and signed the same with my own hand.

This the last Will and Testament of James Thompson dec. and was exhibited in Court and duly proved by the Oaths of Thomas O'Neill and Ross B. Thompson two of the subscribing Witnesses thereto and desired to be Recorded.

On the motion of William Thompson one of the Executors named in the last Will and Testament of James Thompson dec. who came into Court and entered into bond with John Thompson and Ross B. Thompson his securities in the penalty of \$3000 conditioned as the Law directs and took the Oaths provided by Law, Oathes of the said Will is granted him in due form and leave is given Archibald Thompson to qualify at a future day.

151. I James Percy Senr of the County of Vazewell and State of Virginia do hereby make my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that to wit
1st I give unto my living children that is Nancy Bandy, Samuel Percy, William Percy, Nelly Whitman, James Percy, Hannah Percy and Michael Percy all the money that I have on hand to be divided in the following way that is to say to be equally divided among them all and my daughter Nancy Bandy and my son Michael Percy's part is to remain in the hands of my Executors and to be paid to them in the following way my daughter Nancy Bandy is to receive her part in five annual payments, and my son Michael Percy to be paid in seven annual payments and the first payments to be made within one month after my Death.

2nd I give to my daughter Nelly Whitman my Negro Girl Sally.

3rd I give to my daughter Hannah Percy my young bay horse saddle and bridle, my loom and spew, my square table and three chairs, one little wheel and sheep reek, and also two hedges and one skillet all of the small kind also one large sugar Kettle and one large pot, sixteen Geese and bed and furniture, and bedstead and my Bureau also my Negro Girl Nancy, and three breeding sows, & 2 bee hives and three Cows and hedges, my bed & furniture.

4th I give to my son William Percy my old tract of land whereon now live containing two hundred and twenty seven acres, my brown horse and the timber wheels, all the horse gear and plows that on the place and two feather beds, one gilt bed and the other the white bed, with three furniture except a rug which I allow to Nancy Bandy.

5th I leave to my son Jas Percy John Crockett's receipt for two hundred and fifty Dollars which I paid him for my son James.

6th I give to my son in law John Crockett my rifle gun.

7th I give to my grand son Addison Crockett my silver Watch.

8th I give to my three living daughters all my wives clothes to be divided in three equal parts and for my daughter Hannah to have choice of lots.

9th I leave to my three grand children John Rufus and Robert Crockett fifty Dollars each to be paid out of my estate towards educating them.

10th I give my negro woman Nancy to my three daughters Nancy Bandy, Nelly Whitman and Hannah Percy for her to live with each of them.
