

In the names of God Amen, the thirteenth day of May 1800, I James
Wall of Bluestone Settlement in Wythe County, being of legal age, of body,
of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God, therefore calling
to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men
once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament; that is to
say, principally first of all, I give and recommend my soul into the hands of
mighty God that gave it me, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in
quiet Christian burial at the direction of my executors, nothing doubting but
at the General resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power
of God, and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God
to bless me within this life I give and dispose of the same in the following
manner and form. Inprimis, first of all I give that all my lawful debts shall
be paid, then I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Catharine my dearly beloved
if all my estate real and personal, during her life and widowhood, I also give
at my wife's second marriage or death, my whole personal estate shall be sold &
equally divided, between my son James Wall and John Wall, & Barbara
Wall and Peggy Wall and Ruth Wall and David Wall, also I give to my
dear beloved daughter Sally Wall the sum of five shillings sterling, I also give
to Mary Wall and Lydia Wall each the sum of five shillings sterling, I also
give to my son David Wall, my home plantation of one hundred acres situate to full
go if not, to be sold and equally divided between John and the three above
mentioned Sisters, I likewise constitute make and ordain Catharine my beloved wife
as John Sasey to be my sole executor of this my last Will & Testament
as having utterly disavowed, revoked and annulled all and every other former Testament or
Testaments by me in any ways before named, ratifying and confirming this and no other to
be my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and

In the Name of God Amen, I John Bristow
of Tazewell County and State of Virginia, being sick and weak
in body but of sound mind and disposing memory, for which I thank God
and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life, and being desirous
to dispose of all such worldly estate it hath pleased God to bless me
I give and bequeath the same in the manner following, that is to say
I give and bequeath to my son John Bristow twenty pounds in hand
to be taken out of my estate the first of all besides his natural share
and to my sons James Bristow one certain parcel of land taken of
my tract whereon I live on, and I give it to him it having no con-
nection with the rest of my estate and the bound is as follows beg-
ing at a peach that comes from Richards Steels where my line
crosses, and then straight to a corner at his side of the Wagon Road, the
next to my house is a conditional line between my son Isaac
Bristow and myself and all of the other side it is my request
he shall have a title made to him, and besides, I give to my son
John the plantation Snow live on that is after the decease of my wife
for him to have it all to his own uses to do as he pleases with it, he
and his heirs, and as for the rest of my estate that is to say all my
movable property, I give in the following manner that is after John
divided between my four sons, that is to say my wife testeth
Bristow and my son James Bristow, and my son Isaac Bristow
and my son John Bristow, and as for a debt that is owing me on
Kentucky I would wish for my three sons to have it to themselves every
one an equal part of it and every one to be an equal part of
the expense in getting it, and further I leave my trusty friends James
Bristow Isaac Bristow and John Bristow executors, to manage
the same according to this my last Will and Testament and I do hereby
revoke all other former Wills or Testaments by me heretofore made
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my
Seal this twenty first day of June one thousand eight hundred
and one

 with John Wilson now deceased. After he read the wound
 by which he died your deponent said to the said Wilson or to the
 the S. Wilson if he did not think it would be right to make
 a Will as he then appeared to be in his right mind, and his wound
 very dangerous, Wilson then answered and said yes he wanted his
 debt paid for the first place and if there was any thing left (or the
 balance of his estate) to go to that poor young woman that has been
 so kind to him and has taken so much care of him, your deponent
 then asked who that young woman was, the S. Wilson answered it was
 Nancy Turner. Further your deponent said not Given under
