I James Witten senjor of Squalls Creek and Sale of Virginia being seized to dispose of all my estate Both real and personal in manner and form that is to say I do declare that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid out of my estate as I shall hereafter direct by my executors which I shall direct

1st I give to my son Samuel Witten a tract of land on which he now lives and which is valued to him at one thousand dollars and other property to the amount of one hundred and sixty dollars

2nd I give to my son William Witten a tract of land on which he now lives one parcel of which is known by the name of the middle tract and five acres which I purchased of Thomas and Crockett and part of the tract I now live on beginning at a water hole in a Spar of the Creek viz the corner of the piece here first before named then running to the top of the said ridge and with the ridge to my farm and thence to a post mark the third of a bush and thence to the head of a hollow about four or five rods and with the hollow to the road and with a stake line to a water hole the

beginning corner of the middle tract and which is valued to him at one thousand dollars and other property to the amount of one hundred and

seventy dollars 4th I give to my son Thomas Witten one horse and one led to the amount of one hundred and forty dollars and one thousand and thirty dollars more at my and my wife's death if my estate will admit of it 5th I give to my daughter Lemmy Croft property to the amount of two hundred and forty eight dollars and nine Cents and twenty two

dollars more at my and my wife's death if my estate will admit of it 6th I give to my daughter Dorothy Quinn property to the amount of five hundred and forty dollars and six hundred and thirty dollars more at mine and my

wife's death if my estate will admit of it 7th I give to my daughter Charles Quinn property to the amount of two hundred and thirty dollars and nine hundred and forty dollars more at mine and my wife's death if my estate will admit of it 8th I give to my daughter Eliza Quinn property to the amount of two hundred and thirty dollars and one dollar more if demanded at mine and my wife's death

9th I give to my daughter Matilda Thompson property to the amount of two hundred and sixty eight dollars and nine hundred and ^{and two dollars} more at my and my wife's death if my estate will admit of it

10th I give to my daughter Mary Thompson property to the amount of two hundred and sixty eight dollars and nine hundred and ^{and two dollars} more at my and my wife's death if my estate will admit of it

11th I give to my daughter Sarah Thompson property to the amount of two hundred and sixty eight dollars and nine hundred and ^{and two dollars} more at my and my wife's death if my estate will admit of it

12th I give to my son James Witten the plantation I now live on with the exception of the part I gave to William Witten and a young boy and

13th I give that all my Real and property personal Estate and not herebefore mentioned horse and Cattle & farming tools and public possessions on this plantation to my wife Anne Witten during her life Lastly I constitute and appoint Samuel Witten and William Thompson Executors to this my last will and testament signed in due published and solemn as for the last will and testament of James Witten senjor in presence of us this 22 day of April 1826

for as he is bound to make do consequence once to me 3rd To my daughter Emily Thompson I give my negro man slave named Isaac and his wife

4th To my grand daughter Mary Thompson I give one feather bed and furniture

5th To my grand daughter Hannah Harrison Thomas Harrison daughter I give one feather bed and furniture

6th I give to my daughter in law W. Harrison one cow

Carroll, Peggy Hall, Jane Witten, Elizabeth Peery, Camela Gibson, Abba Rutledge having decided away that part of my land intended for my sons Andrew and Thomas to them I do
