In the name of God. I, Thomas Perry son of the County of Spotsylvania and State of Virginia being old and upright in body but of a sound and disposing mind, and calling to mind the frailty of my body, and knowing that it is by God appointed for me now never to die; do hereby make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, in the following manner - that is to say,

First. I recommend my soul, to God, who gave it, to be buried in Christian like manner, at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter to be named.

And as to my worldly affairs or Estate, that it hath pleased God to bless me with, I bequeath and dispose of in the following manner that is to say, First. I desire that all my just Debts be paid.

Secondly. I give to my two eldest sons Jonathan and James Perry one Dollar each they having heretofore received their parts.

I give to my son William Perry fifty pounds in order to make his share with what he has received equal to his elder brothers Jonathan & James.

I give unto my son Thomas Perry two Cows and Calves he also having rec^d his part heretofore.

I give unto my son Joseph Perry, my land where I formerly lived containing three hundred and six acres more or less also two cows and calves with the three horse harts owned by him.

I give unto my son Harvey Perry the tract of Land that I now live on, containing, one hundred and thirty two acres more or less, I also leave to my son Harvey, my negro boy Fed, and a horse worth one hundred Dollars with a new bridle and saddle, and two cows and calves.

I give to my two eldest Daughters Polly Perry and Nancy Helms, the sum of one Dollar each, they having heretofore received their parts.

I give to my Daughter Rebecca Perry, my negro girl. The next eldest to the girl that I gave Nancy Helms, I also allow my daughter Rebecca a horse worth thirty Dollars, a bridle and furniture, and two cows & calves.

I also give to my other two Daughters - Nelly and Parvittie the same as their sister Rebecca by giving to Nelly the next eldest Negro girl to Rebecca having the youngest negro girl to Parvittie.

I also allow one bed and furniture to my three sons Thomas Joseph and Harvey, that is one bed and furniture to each.

And all the balance of my Estate not herein mentioned or disposed of, I allow after my decease to be equally divided among all my children.

T. Perry Will I do hereby constitute and appoint my two sons Jonathan & Thomas Perry, my Executors to this my last will and Testament, in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 6th day of August 1817.
