I Robert Barnum of Tazewell County and State of Virginia
do hereby make my last Will and Testament in manner & form
following, that is to say, 1st my desire is that my beloved wife Grace
be possessed of the plantation houses, and one full third of
the plantations on which I now live, as also one full third of my stock
of every kind and of my whole Estate both real and personal for every
kind and description whatever to be possessed and enjoyed by her the said
Grace Barnum her lawful posterity for and during her natural life
and at her death the whole to descend to my two sons viz William
Barnum and John Barnum. 2nd the land on which I live, I
wish to be divided between my two sons aforesaid in such manner
that quantity and quality considered, each shall may be of equal value
as nearly as possible, such division to be made when the youngest
of my 2^d sons viz John Barnum shall arrive to lawful age to be
possessed of said Estate, and in case such division cannot be made
conveniently without leaving the improvement, or the greater part thereof
in one place, then the person to whom I improve said land shall
I shall pay to the other a sum equivalent to the difference in the
real value of said lots respectively. 3rd the afo^d tract of land with
the appurtenances, I do hereby best in the said William & John
Barnum and their heirs forever, once reserving my wife's dower in said
plantation during her life viz of 1/3rd I give to my son in
law John Goodwin one milk cow which I wish to be
delivered to Mr Goodwin immediately after my death. 4th I desire
that my stock and other personal property (not herein bequeathed)
shall be sold in the manner prescribed by law except such
part thereof as my Executor shall in their discretion judge to be
necessary to retain for the support of the family and for working
the plantations, and the money arising from the sale to be
reserved till the s^d William and John Barnum come to full age
then to be paid to them or their legal representatives by my Executor
5th my wish & desire is that my Executor appropriate the profits
arising from the two thirds of the plantations separate from my
wife's dower, to the education & other necessary expenditures in the
bringing up my afo^d son viz William & John Barnum
Lastly I hereby constitute & appoint Charles Young, an
Humble Wilson Executor of this my last Will and Testament
and do hereby utterly disavow, revoke and annul every former
Will by me at any time heretofore made, and declared this and

The last Will and Testament of Robert Barnes dec^d
was exhibited in Court and proven by the oath of David
Ward and Hugh Wilson witnesses thereto subscribed
and Ordered to be recorded

In the Name of God amen, I Robert Whitley
of Tazewell County, State of Virginia, being weak in body
but of sound mind and memory, calling to mind the mortality of my
body and knowing that it is appointed unto all men once to die
do make and declare this my last Will and Testament, in the manner
following, to wit, that is to say, I recommend my Soul unto God
who gave it, nothing doubting, but shall receive the same at the
General resurrection, and my body to the earth to be decently buried
at the discretion of my Executors hereafter to be named. Item
I leave & bequeath to my well beloved wife Jane Whitley, my household
furniture with her bed and furniture and two mules
Cows and the Suck mare and if the said mare dies it is my will that
my son furnish her one of equal value. Item I leave & bequeath
to my son William's son, William & Daughter Nancy, each one
dollar to be paid out of my Estate by my Executors, their father
having sold his share. Item I give and bequeath to

Mary Wynne sixty pounds in property. Item I give & bequeath to
my daughter Sarah Wynne thirty pounds out of my Estate. Item
I leave sixty pounds in property out of my Estate, and also I
leave and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Wynne, sixty pounds
out of my Estate. Item I leave & bequeath to my well beloved
wife Jane, my Negro boy George, only him to be under my
son David's direction. He should as the said David giving to her
a sufficient support agreeable to her age & infirmities, the said
Negro to be at my wife's call when she pleases. Item I leave & bequeath
to my son David Whitley, the plantation whereon I now live, together
with all my lands to him his heirs and assigns forever, also all the
remainder of my personal Estate. I nominate constitute appoint
my son David Whitley my son in law, Josiah Wynne, my son
in law, to this my last Will and Testament, reading all other
Wills and Testaments, publishing and declaring this my last Will
and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereto set my hand
