The last Will and Testament of Robert Barnes dec^d
was exhibited in Court and proven by the oath of David
Ward and Hugh Wilson witnesses thereto subscribed
and Ordered to be recorded

In the Name of God amen, I Robert Whitley
of Tazewell County, State of Virginia, being weak in body
but of sound mind and memory, calling to mind the mortality of my
body and knowing that it is appointed unto all men once to die
do make and declare this my last Will and Testament, in the manner
following, to wit, that is to say, I recommend my Soul unto God
who gave it, nothing doubting, but shall receive the same at the
General resurrection, and my body to the earth to be decently buried
at the discretion of my Executors hereafter to be named. Item
I leave & bequeath to my well beloved wife Jane Whitley, my household
furniture with her bed and furniture and two mules
Cows and the Suck mare and if the said mare dies it is my will that
my son furnish her one of equal value. Item I leave & bequeath
to my son William's son, William & Daughter Nancy, each one
dollar to be paid out of my Estate by my Executors, their father
having sold his share. Item I give and bequeath to

Mary Wynne sixty pounds in property. Item I give & bequeath to
my daughter Sarah Wynne thirty pounds out of my Estate. Item
I leave sixty pounds in property out of my Estate, and also I
leave and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Wynne, sixty pounds
out of my Estate. Item I leave & bequeath to my well beloved
wife Jane, my Negro boy George, only him to be under my
son David's direction. He should as the said David growing to her
a sufficient support agreeable to her age & infirmities, the said
Negro to be at my wife's call when she pleases. Item I leave & bequeath
to my son David Whitley, the plantation whereon I now live, together
with all my lands to him his heirs and assigns forever, also all the
remainder of my personal Estate. I nominate constitute appoint
my son David Whitley my son in law, Josiah Wynne, my son
in law, to this my last Will and Testament, reading all other
Wills and Testaments, publishing and declaring this my last Will
and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereto set my hand
and Seal this fourteenth day of June one thousand eight hundred
& two
