In the name of God I Name & Thomas Peery, Senior of the County of Saxewell State of Virginia being old and infirm in body but of a sound and disposing mind, and calling to mind the frailty of my body, and knowing that it is by God appointed for all men once to die; do hereby make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, in the following manner—that is to say,

First. I recommend my soul to God, who gave it, to be buried in Christian like manner, at the direction of my executors hereafter to be named.

And as to my worldly affairs or Estate, that it hath pleased God to bless me with I bequeath and dispose of in the following manner that is to say.

First. I desire that all my just Debts be paid.

Secondly. I give to my two eldest sons Jonathan and James Peery one Dollar each they having heretofore received their parts.

I give to my son William Peery fifty pounds in order to make his share with what he has received equal to his elder brothers Jonathan & James.

I give unto my son Thomas Peery two Cows and Calves he also having received his part heretofore.

I give unto my son George Peery, my land where I formerly lived containing three hundred thirty six acres more or less also two cows and Calves with the three horse beasts now claimed by him.

133. I give unto my son Harvey Peery the tract of Land that I now have, containing, one hundred and thirty two acres more or less, also leave to my son Harvey, my negro boy Ted, and a horse worth one hundred Dollars with a new bridle and Saddle, and two Cows and Calves.

I give to my two eldest Daughters Polly Peery and Nancy Helms, the sum of one Dollar each, they having heretofore received their parts.

I give to my Daughter Rebecca Peery, my negro girl. The next oldest to the girl that I gave Nancy Helms, I also allow my daughter Rebecca a horse worth eighty Dollars, a Negroe and furniture, and two Cows & Calves.

I also give to my other two daughters Polly and Parmitry the sum aforesaid to their Sister Rebecca by giving to Polly the next oldest Negro girl to Rebecca having the youngest negro girl to Parmitry.

I also allow one bed and furniture to my third son Thomas Joseph and Parmitry, that is one bed and furniture to each.

And all the balance of my Estate not herein mentioned or disposed of, I allow after my decease to be equally divided among all my children.

To George Peery constable an appeal my two sons Jonathan & Thomas Peery, my executors to this my last will and Testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 6th day of August 1817.
