for Rebecca Suiter one dollar to her and her heirs forever, the foregoing legacies
are to be discharged out of my estate by my executors. 5 I give unto my
beloved wife all my real or landed estate held by deed Patent or otherwise
all my negroes male and female all my stock of horses hounds and
such other as are now in my possession and shall be hereafter acquired

other kind of goods or chattels whatsoever during her natural life and at her death I do give and devise the whole of the legacy devised to my wife (and held in trust by her) for their benefit, to my children by my present wife (viz) Peggy, William, Lydia, Henry, John, & Benjamin Robbins and to them and their heirs forever to be equally divided amongst them, at the death of my said wife only such part of of such part of such estate as may be necessary for my said wife to use to support & school my said children by my present wife (viz) Peggy, William, Lydia, Henry, John & Benjamin Robbins and pay the four first Legacies, lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my wife Rebecca executrix and Daniel Bay executor of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other Wills, testaments, Legacies, Bequest, and executors by me or any of us before named written and bequeathed, testifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testimony. I do give and bequeath unto my son William P. Hindrick and James P. Hindrick the said tract of land on which I now live and all my right title and interest to so much of the tract of land on which Brooks Matney now live, as lie on the south side of Clinch River and also all my land lying in the sink, except the Shortridge tract.

I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Polly Clark formerly Polly Hindrick the tract of land on which she now lives.

I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Jane Brown formerly Jane Hindrick the Shortridge tract of land lying in the sink as above named.

I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Isabella Scott formerly Isabella Hindrick a part of the Trout tract of land as may be on the south side of Clinch River, it being the tract on which Robert Shortridge now lives.
