I Ginny Whitley of Tazewell County widow of Robert Whitley dec^d do hereby make my last will & Testament in the manner & form as followeth to wit first I recommend my soul to god the giver & after my decease my Body to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named I will & Bequeath all my right title claim & interest that I have to my negro George to my son David Whitley & also one pit and kettle & the one fourth part of my two beds & furniture that to them secondly I Give to my daughter Polly Upmre the fourth part of the ~~same~~ furniture that to my two beds & one third of my clothing, Thirdly I Give to my daughter Ginny Bock the one fourth part of my two beds & what furniture that to them & one third part of my clothing, - fourthly I Give to my daughter Polly Upmre the one fourth part of my two beds & what furniture that to them & the one third part of my clothing, fifthly I do give to the heirs of my son Robert Whitley dec^d namely Aaron & William one third each of my negro demand to from my Executors here after named - & if there be any thing of my Estate that I have before named I Bequeath it to my two Executors here ^{after} named - Sixthly & lastly I nominate & appoint my son David Whitley & Joseph Upmre Executors to this my last will & Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 12th day of March 1812

In the name of God Amen, I George Wagoner of the County of Edgewell & Commonwealth of Virginia, having yet a sound mind & disposing memory (for which I thank God) but calling to mind the uncertainty of human life & being desirous to dispose of such Estate as it has been pleased God to bless me with — I do give & bequeath to my sons Elias Adams & Higham all my lands on Rimboltards fork in the above County to be divided as follows (to wit) I give & bequeath to my son Elias the lower end of my land which is to say a straight line with the fence along the lower end of my lower field on North west direction to the Creek & George & up said Creek to a marked line across O. land to the old line, also five head of cattle & two sheep & one horse & one rifle gun & one mans saddle & four head of hogs also a head with its appurtenances & one pig — Secondly I give & bequeath to my son Adams the upper end of my land namely the new survey of 200 acres, & my son Adams is to have an equal mity of that property with my above named son Elias — Thirdly I give & bequeath to my son Higham the thorn place namely all my land between the above mentioned lines & also an equal mity of that property with my other two sons, but it is to be understood that I give possession of the thorn place to my wife to have the whole use of the houses with the house hold & kitchen furniture the farming utensils with all the stock of every description whatsoever to be devoted to her own use as long as she lives — but it is to be understood that my other two daughters that is single, namely Rebecca Elizabeth is to have an equal mity with my daughter Peggy which is here named to the two married daughters &c
