County of Tazewell, County being sick and weak in body but
of sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God
and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being
desirous to dispose of all such worldly Estate and hath pleased
God to bless me with I do hereby make my last will and
testament in the manner and form following that is to say
Firstly I desire that all the perishable part of my Estate be
immediately sold after my Death and all of the moneys arising
there from all my just bills and funeral expenses to be paid
Secondly after the payment of my bills and funeral expenses
I give to my Wife Margaret Shannon one third part of my
Estate Both real and personal for and during her natural
Life and after her Decease I give the same to my Children
hereafter named in following manner that is to say
Thirdly I give to my son Thomas Shannon my Daughter
Agnes Shannon Elizabeth Shannon and also believing my
Wife to be in a State of pregnancy the Issue of that Birth
to share Equal with the above mentioned Son and two I give
all my land and personal Estate Except Two hundred dollars
hereafter mentioned Equally to be divided among them and
enjoyed by them and their heirs forever
Fourthly I give to William Shannon son of Nancy Thompson
and Nancy Under the daughter of Susanna Under Two hundred
dollars to be Equally divided between them to them and to their
Heirs And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my
friends John Shannon and George Hudson Executors
of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all
other former wills or testaments by me hereto before made
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
my Seal this 24th day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand
Eight hundred and Twenty Eight
