in Body but of Sound Mind and Memory and Calling to Mind
the Mortality of my Body and Knowing it is appointed for all
Men to die do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament
in manner and following first I Recommend my Soul to the
God who gave it and my Body the Earth to be Buried in a
Decent manner at the Discretion of my Executors first I
Will all of my just Debts to be paid out of my Estate I Give
and Bequeath to my wife Phillis the plantation I now live on
with the appurtenances thereunto Belonging also all the Slaves
and Stock and house hold and Kitchen furniture and all the
farming utensils Except what I shall Bestow on my
Children here after named for the Support of her and
her Children During her widow hood but if she should
marry she is only to have a feller Bed and furniture and
Ten pounds Exclusive of her thirds I Give and bequeath to
the heirs of Nath. to askham Decent and to Orphy Edward
my two eldest Daughters one Dollar each they having
Received their part and to Sally James my third Daughter ten
pounds in trade she having Received her part I Give and
Bequeath to my son John Wynne and Hugh Curwin all
my Wreath and title to a piece of land called and known by the
name of the Rolling plantation whereon Henry Harman
now lives that they gain said land they are to repay to mee
on my Heirs all costs here to fore Expended on the same that of
Charles Maty I Give and Bequeath to my five sons William
Joshua Elkanah Abner and Harman some of my just debts
to have twenty pounds each in trade they having got their part
before to be paid at the Discretion of my Executors when they see -

Best says I Give and bequeath to my sons John and William my
present slaves children the tract of land I now live on to be Equally
Divided According to quantity and quality after the death or
marriage of their mother and the two hundred and sixty six acres
of land lying in parcels Valley I Give and bequeath to my sons Samuel
Robert Henry Peter and James to be Equally divided between
them According to quantity and quality my land lying in hicks
garden I Give and bequeath to my son Miner also that my
son John be furnished with two cows and calves two years
and lambs and two and furniture also my seven youngest sons
namely Samuel Robert Henry Peter William James and Miner
with a horse beast saddle and bridle two cows and calves two
years and lambs and a bed and furniture each and my Daughters
Mary one Dollar she having got her part and my daughter
Phily and Margaret one Dollar each they having got
their parts also Elizabeth Martha Anna and Nancy to have
one Mare and both Saddle and Bridle two cows and
calves two years and lambs each the youngest to be
furnished with clothes Equal to the two oldest and
with all to be furnished with house hold furniture
equal to the three that are married at the discretion
of my executors also I live my best Smith tools and
my Rifle and that Gun for the use of the family
during my Wife's widowhood further I wish money to be
raised out of estate to school my Children that has
not a sufficient portion lastly I nominate and appoint
my Wife Phillis and my son Joseph and others to have
care of this my last Will and Testament, Witness my
hand and Seal this 11th day of May 1800
