This Indenture made this 19th day of
October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and six. Between John G. Utstick printer in the
town of Abingdon in the state of Virginia of the one
part and David Campbell of the same place of
the other part Witnesseth that the said John
G. Utstick for and in consideration of the sum
of five hundred dollars current money to him in
hand paid by William King and William King &
Company he doth bargain and sell unto the said
David Campbell his printing press types cases stands
and every thing appertaining to the printing office of
the said Utstick in the said town of Abingdon to
have and to hold the said printing office with
its appurtenances unto the said David Campbell
and his heirs to the sole use and behoof of
him the said David Campbell and his heirs
forever. In trust nevertheless that if the said
John G. Utstick shall well and truly pay unto the said
William King & Co. the amount of what he shall
justly stand indebted to them upon a settlement and
shall also pay unto William King whatever shall
remain of the sum of five hundred dollars after
the payment of the account of the said King and Co.
within twelve months from the date hereof then
this Indenture and every thing herein contained
shall be utterly null and void. And in further
trust that if the said John G. Utstick shall
not within twelve months from the date hereof
well and truly to pay unto the said William
King & Company whatever shall appear to be
justly due to them and to William King & Co. the
balance of the said sum of five hundred
dollars after the payment of the account due to
William King & Company within twelve months
from the date hereof then it shall and may

be lawful for the said David Campbell to expose to public sale the said printing ^{press} with its appurtenances to the highest bidder for ready money before the front door of the Courthouse of Washington County after having given ten days previous notice at least of the time and place of the sale by putting up an advertisement for that space of time at the front door of the Courthouse of the said County and publishing the same in the Western Intelligencer. And out of the proceeds of the said sale to pay the said William King & Company whatever shall then be due to them and the balance if any to be paid William King & Company whereof the said John G. Wick and David Campbell have become set their hands and seals the day and year first above written
