 Twelve Shillings Virginia money for me in hand paid by Andrew Sullivan, Have bargained & sold
 to the said Andrew the whole crop of Small grain now growing on the plantation wherein I
 now live, supposed to be about nine acres of Rye and three Acres of Wheat to the same
 more or less. And I do warrant the said Grant to the said Andrew against all
 Persons - Witness my Hand and Seal the Twenty second day of May One
 Thousand seven hundred and eighty four

I Jas: Mason of Washington Virginia being in perfect
mind and Memory Blessed be God for it, do constitute & appoint
this my Last will and Testament in manner and form as
follows Viz I appoint Daniel Bartan my Ex^{or} in this my last
Will and Testament. To collect all my Lawfull debts and
pay the same as he shall see fit. To the said
Bartan Two Hundred Pounds if so much remains of my Estate
And the said Bartan having agreed to Distill sixty Bushels
of Rye for which I have payed the Rent of the Still, is to
have Four hundred pound as a just debt and the remainder
if any, I do will and appoint to Samuel Buchanan In
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal
this twenty seventh day of March one thousand seven
hundred & Eighty

At a court held for Washington County the 20th day of June 1830 This last Will and Testament of James Watson dec^d was proven in Court by the oaths of James Huston and William Edmiston the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

Know all Men by these presents that I, Alexander More of Washington County and State of Virginia, have bargained and sold, and made over unto Andrew Williamson of the said County and State, all the Cattle that grazed on the plantation I now live on, to wit: One black and white Cow, with a short tail, and one red and white doo, also one white Horse, about eight years old; for and in consideration of the sum of Seven pounds to me in hand paid the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge. And I hereby warrant and defend said Horses unto the said Williamson, from all Men, as owners of Persons, living and just claim thereto. Witness my hand, and seal this twenty second day of May, One thousand seven hundred and eighty five.
