

Alexander Roseburn of the County of Washington and State of Virginia being of sound mind and disposing memory do make this my last will and testament in manner following, to wit, that is to say I give and bequeath to my wife Charaty Roseburn one Grea slaves with her bed & furniture and to have the benefits of the plantation during her natural life and also one Read Milch cow Secondly I Give and bequeath to my daughter Eave all my part of the plantation I now live on at her mothers death to be freely possessed by her thirdly I Give and bequeath to my two daughters Mary Clyard and Charaty Miller all the rest of my personal property after my debts is paid and burial charges Excepting some Cows & Hogs and Sheep which belongs to Eave and Run with my Stock he to Equally devide betwixt them the said Mary Clyard and Charaty Miller and I do hereby constitute and appoint John Roseburn Executor of this my last will and Testament hoping that he will execute it according to the true intent thereof

Witness my hand and seal this twenty sixth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight Hundred and Six Signed Sealed published and pronounced by the said Alexander Roseburn as his last will and Testament who was of disposing mind and memory in our presence who signed it at his Request

At a Court held for Washington County the 17th day of June 1806.

The last Will & Testament of Alexander Roseburn dec^d was exhibited into Court proven by the oaths of James Keys & John Roseburn two of the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. On the motion of John Roseburn who took the oath of an executor prescribed by law & entered into & acknowledged his bond with the Clerk of Court security in the sum of five hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs a certificate is therefore granted him for the probat of the last Will & Testament of Alex^r Roseburn dec^d in due form
