First I recommend my soul to God who give it hoping that he may receive it through the Merits of my all gracious Redeemer Jesus Christ my body I give unto the earth from whence I was taken to be buried in a decent Christian manner at the discretion

of my Executors hereafter named. — My just debts I allow to be paid; and all my estate afterwards remaining, both real and personal I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife Jean Smith; likewise all my slaves, Bonds, Bills and Book accounts to her own further use to either retain or sell as she may think proper, and I do constitute the said Jean Smith my well beloved wife my sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament and I do revoke and disannul all other Wills and Testaments, and do publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this twenty Ninth day of December 1786
