This last Will & Testament of Sabeus Main dec<sup>d</sup>. was produced in Court & proven by the oath of John Houtton and Benjamin Martin two of the witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded. & at a Court held for the said County the 19<sup>th</sup> day of December 1809 On the motion of Timothy Main & Sabeus Main <sup>the executors</sup> thereto named who took the oath of an executor prescribed by Law Vented into and acknowledged their bonds with Jacob Rouse John Rouse & James Robinson securities in the sum of \$3,000 conditioned as the law directs & certification is therefore granted them for the probate of this said Will in due form.

In the name of God Amen I Alexander Wyke of Washington County being sick and weak in body but of a sound mind & disposing memory for which I thank God, and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life & being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with I give & bequeath the same in manner following that is to say.

1<sup>st</sup> I desire that all my Just debts that I owe be paid, and those that are due me collected immediately after my decease.

2<sup>nd</sup> After the payment of my debts & funeral expences I give unto my wife Mary Wyke the tract of land I now live on with all the appurtenances thereto belonging, and also one other tract of land lying in Lee County whereon my son James Wyke now lives containing four hundred & thirteen acres by survey with all its appurtenances and also one Negro girl named Sena about fifteen years of age also my Waggon & gear & all my stock of every kind including all my horse beasts cattle sheep & hogs also all my House hold & Kitchen furniture with all my Farming utensils, to be enjoyed by her during her life except what I dispose of hereafter in another manner.

3<sup>rd</sup> After the decease of my Wife Mary Wyke I give unto my Daughter Catherine Banning & her heirs the Negro girl above mentioned named Sena.

4<sup>th</sup> After the decease of my Wife I give unto my son James Wyke the tract of land I now live on and the one my son James Wyke now lives on (except one hundred & fifty acres I shall hereafter mention) with all the appurtenances belonging to both tracts of land to the sole use of him & his heirs forever And also my Waggon & gear stock of every kind horses cattle sheep house hold & kitchen furniture & farming utensils for the use of him & his heirs forever except what I shall hereafter particularly mention I also give unto my son James Wyke one set of black smith tools which he is now to receive.

5<sup>th</sup> I give unto my Daughter Nancy Richardson & her

Heirs twenty pounds to be paid to her by James Wylie out of my personal estate at the decease of my Wife Mary Wylie.

I give unto my Grandson William Wylie one hundred & fifty acres of Land lying in Lee County part of the S. tract whereon James Wylie now lives to include the improvement whereon Christl. Plank now lives provided my son James Wylie does not obtain a lawfull Title for a tract of land lying on Richland Creek the waters of Elk river in the State of Tennessee but if he does obtain a good Title for the said land on Richland Creek William Wylie is to have one hundred & fifty acres of that and of an equality in soil with the remainder Part of said land & to be laid off at one side or end of the survey as James Wylie chooses & then the land in Lee County whereon Plank lives is to descend to James Wylie & his heirs also to William Wylie & his heirs one bed & furniture and lastly

I do hereby constitute & appoint my son James Wylie & James Davis Exors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other former wills or testaments by me heretofore made in Witness whereof I have unto set my hand & affixed my seal this 1<sup>st</sup> day December 1809

This last will & testament of Alexander Wylie dec<sup>d</sup> was exhibited into Court proven by the oath of James Campbell, & Benjamin McCarty two of the subscribing Witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of James Wylie one of the Executors therein named who took the oath of an executor prescribed by law & entered into & acknowledged his bond with Benjamin McCarty, James Campbell & Charles Tate securities in the sum of three thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, a Certificate is therefore granted him for the Probate of the said will in due form.
