 in that case made and provided have and by these presents
 Do bind Out a Girl named Sarah Sharp Sharp who was
 Born in the Year of our Lord God, one thousand seven hundred
 and seventy six September fifteenth apprentice to s.^d Martin
 Gash to serve him or his assigns from the day of the date
 hereof for and during the Term Prescribed by law and do by
 their presents Covenant that the s.^d Sarah Sharp shall
 well and truly serve her s.^d Master or his Lawfull assigns
 for and during the s.^d time According to the laws and custom
 of this State and the s.^d Master for him self his heirs
 and assigns in Consideration thereof Doth hereby Covenant.

of sound Judgment do make this my last Will and Testament, I recommend my Soul to the
Mercy of Almighty God. My Body I desire may be decently entred and I do dispose of my
Worldly goods I estate in manner following viz. I give unto my Brother Charles Carter
one Negro Man named Tom and one Negro Boy named Jacob and one Negro Woman
named Jude, and all her increase and all the Stock I do possess I leave all this to my Brother
Charles Carter of his my last Will and Testament, Signed sealed and Delivered in the
presence of and published this fifteenth day of January One thousand eight hundred and
eighty one
