

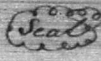

out of the price of the land whereon I now live when it shall be sold.

Mare and one Cow which she is to have when she marries and

also fifty pounds Virginia Money out of the price of the land

whereon I now live when it shall be sold. I also give and bequeath

unto my dear Daughter William fifty pounds out of the price

of the above mentioned Land when it shall be sold. And now

I here give and bequeath all my Estate real and personal unto

my well beloved wife Katharine to be under her particular

management during her natural Life except the two Mares

and two Cows above mentioned which are to be divided out at

the Girls marriage and after the decease of the said Katharine

The land and all other Estate to be sold to the best advantage and after paying each of the above named Girls as above mentioned fifty pounds and also fifteen pounds to Daniel Rouse to be applied as will be of the most benefit for his learning and the remaining part of the Estate to be equally divided among all my Children. And I do hereby constitute my wife Katharine and Conrad Harlock to be my Executors of the above Testament.
